Project Chirag to light up 400th village with solar power

MUMBAI: January 10. 2019 will be a special milestone for Project Chirag as well as the underprivileged beneficiaries of rural India whom the NGO serves, when solar power will be provided to light up the homes. schools, and livelihoods of residents of Baldvachapada. Hirve, in Mokhada block, Maharashtra, making it the 400th village to benefit from their intervention. And to think this village is a mere 4 hours away from the bustling megapolis Mumbai!

What started as a student initiative in 2010 has today grown into an NGO that is working in the area of sustainable energy for rural masses. Says Pratibha Pai, Co-founder & Director of Chirag Rural Development Foundation "What better way to usher in the New Year... we have been instrumental in not just giving light to all the homes and the aanganwadi & primary school in the village, but we have succeeded in bringing water to the village for its drinking and agricultural needs through solar-powered lift irrigation, ensuring that 23 acres of farmland that was being cultivated only during the paddy season will now have yearround cultivation of 'mogra' and vegetables."

Baldyachapada is located on the Sahyadri range, and from most parts of the village a perennial river 'Khunti' is visible – however it is a daily


challenge for the villagers to walk down a few kilometres of rough terrain and climb back balancing 2-3 huge pots of water on their heads. So now to get water at their village from a tap and have pipes irrigating their farms brings excitement and hope into the lives of these tribals. As one elder farmer commented "We are in the winter of our life, but we owe it to our children to give them a better farming option so they do not migrate to the city in search of a living."

Chirag Rural Development Foundation (CRDF), under its flagship Project Chirag, has been working extensively in the tribal areas, providing solar electrification in dark villages across 7 states, namely Maharashtra,
